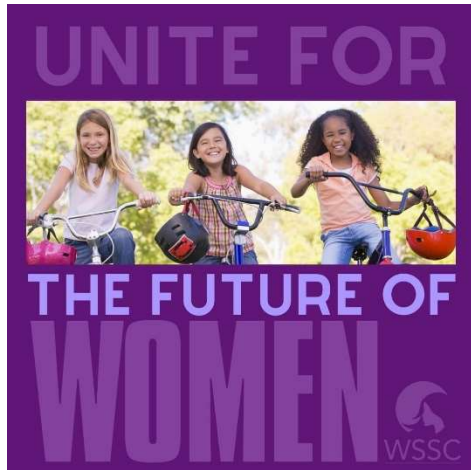

With nearly 300 episodes produced during the COVID-19 global pandemic, The Round Table Talk Show is available on [iheart Radio](#), [YouTube](#), [Tune In](#), [Apple Podcasts](#), [Spotify](#) and major podcast platforms.

In 2021, Ms. Hardie then saw a need for more networking opportunities for Black business owners. She partnered with the [Southern California Black Chamber of Commerce](#) to launch a Chapter in Long Beach, CA.

The SCBCC, a business organization dedicated to improving the economic environment for the minority business community and fostering business development and prosperity, placing particular focus on economic development, community development, public policy, and membership services allows Ms. Hardie the opportunity to further support these businesses.

In her role as President Ms. Hardie serves the minority-owned business community of Long Beach and the surrounding cities of Lakewood, Cerritos, Bellflower, Carson, Torrance, Downey, Lynwood, and Norwalk. "Black-owned small businesses are unequivocally struggling during the economic upheaval caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Most importantly, Black-owned small businesses have struggled for years prior to the global pandemic. Too many business owners are not aware of what resources are available to help keep their businesses afloat," says Ms. Hardie.

Ms. Hardie once again felt she had to do more. It was time to reach more people. She launched [IT TV - The It TV Network](#). A network targeted to business owners, entrepreneurs, C-Suite executives, and creatives. The network currently has airtime available and is considering new content. Laura Cahill had built a successful career in marketing, working for companies such as Whole Foods Market and Vital Proteins. But when she was furloughed in March 2020, she did what many of the rest of us did during the pandemic and went into the kitchen. Cahill combined her love of music and feeding friends, starting a home kitchen business last April named Gewl. Pronounced ghouL, it stands for “Good Eats With Laura” and its logo shows a tattooed arm whose hand raises not an iPhone, but a sandwich

She attributes much of her early success to social media. She made 10 sandwiches and posted them on Instagram with a note that said, “Who’s hungry? I got sandwiches. I’ll deliver them to you tomorrow with fresh-made chips.” She sold 10 in less than an hour, doubled her sales the next week and kept growing as fans, including an influencer friend with 50,000 followers, began posting snapshots and tagging friends.

“After that, it was just kind of crazy. It took off like wildfire for me,” she said. Within months, she attracted attention from concert promoter giant Live Nation, which dug the music theme and reached out to Cahill to put together box lunches for livestreams filming at the Wiltern in Los Angeles. And that’s how her catering company turned into a backstage pass in September 2020.

“I did a full lunch, a private event. It was just the sound guys and I’m feeding the band, Awolnation. I remember going home and I was crying because I was just so happy,” Cahill said in a recent interview. “It was one of those moments where, yes, I’m doing the right thing. I am on the right path. You can never take this away from me.”

A year later, Cahill opened her own storefront at The Hood Kitchen in Costa Mesa, selling [sandwiches](#), chips, desserts and jalapeño ranch sauce at the 300-square-foot space with patio seating that opened last month. All the eats are music-themed and so is the décor. There are vintage audio components and vinyl record album covers of artists such as Tom Petty, Patti Smith, Nirvana, The Clash, Blondie and Jimi Hendrix on the walls along with an electric guitar. Laura Cahill had a successful career in marketing but gave it up to start a deli out of her home kitchen with a music theme. Dr. Sherry Hu was born in the 1970s in China and raised by two well-educated parents, which was very rare during that time. Sherry's father grew up on a farm in Hunan province and went to college as the first college student in his town in 1960. He had to overcome many challenges to attend college as his family was very poor and often hungry. He lost his mom when he was just three years old and did not enter school until he was ten. He understood that the only way to change his life and his family's life was through education. He studied extremely hard at school and earned an exceptional opportunity to attend college. Sherry's mother experienced drought, starving, wars, and dramatic family changes in her childhood. Her father, Sherry's grandpa, was a respected high school teacher in a mid-sized town in Hubei, China, and Sherry's grandma was a typical woman of the time in China, hardworking, kind, brave, and tenacious. She was determined to see that Sherry's mother received an education no matter how difficult it was.

When Sherry was young, her family's budget was very tight, like most families during that period of time in China. However, Sherry always felt fortunate because they had enough food and warm clothing during those years. She learned a critically important financial habit from her parents early in her life. Her parents always planned how much to spend based on how much they earned and never went above. They always saved more than 20% of their salaries, no matter how much they made or how difficult life was.

Current data show that about 70% of Americans have less than \$1000 savings in their bank accounts, which could be less than the cost of a car repair. The interesting contrast is about 50% of people in China have savings - this is just one of many good habits Chinese families carry on from their traditions. Sherry came to the United States in her mid-20s and went to University of Nebraska-Lincoln where she earned her PhD degree. In 2004, she started as an assistant professor at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. She and her husband had two children and began planning for their family's financial needs, They bought a new home, a new van, and started retirement accounts at work. They saved 15-30% of their income and began investing in stocks. By her mid-30s, Sherry and her family were thriving. She also kept up the habit of learning her parents impressed upon her.

“Leadership has been my secret insecurity,” she said, “but I just can’t be without people. I’ve always chosen to be active in community projects.” Shef, her husband of 57 years, is sometimes overwhelmed with Sandra’s demanding schedule. 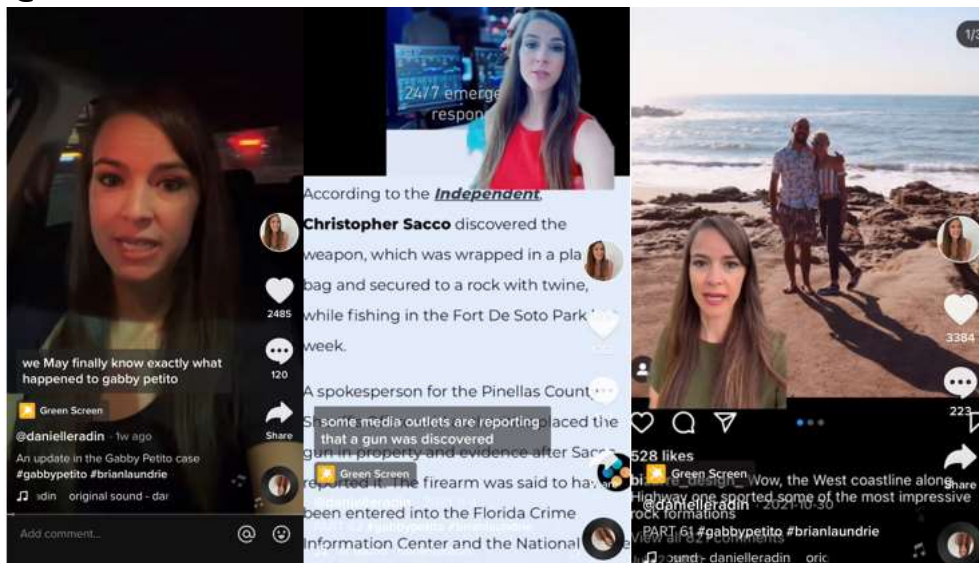

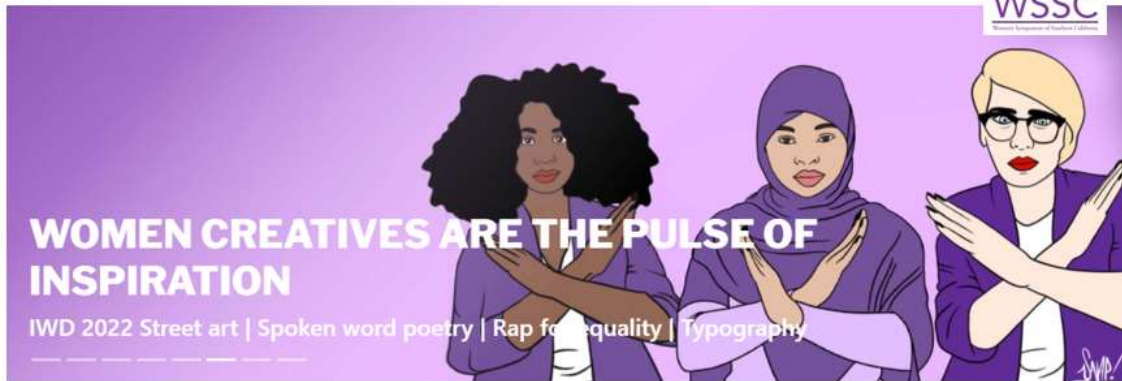
